



# 1997 Honorary Chairman Ronald Rue, Decoy Maker

There is a region deep in southern Maryland, where the mighty Chesapeake Bay entwines its waters with the counties of Somerset, Talbot, and Dorchester, which has been the grounds to millions of waterfowl for many years. Given the abundance of waterfowl, this area has also produced many well-known decoy makers such as the Ward Brothers, Ed Parsons, Ed Phillips, the Elliott Brothers, and more contemporary makers such as Dan Brown, Oliver Lawson and Ron Rue, to name a few. This article focuses on Ron Rue who has graciously honored the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum by becoming the 1997 Decoy Show Honorary Chairman. I have known Mr. Rue for several years and am delighted with the opportunity to share a brief insight of this gentle-



man and quality decoy maker. I have always found him

fun to be with, witty and quick with stories of his early years.

Mr Ronald Rue was born on November 4, 1931, and has lived his entire life in Cambridge.

Dorchester County, Maryland. started Ron hunting, or as he says, "shooting" waterfowl in high school. As he puts it, "we would go up to Dayton's restaurant and listen to find out where the local men were going that day and knowing they had a blind, we would go shoot it." Ron did a lot of marsh duck shooting from blinds and some offshore shooting for canvasbacks, redheads, blackheads

time they arrived on the Eastern Shore and guit hunting when the ducks headed back north.

Ron made his first decoys around 1948 to supplement his rig of decoys which was comprised of decoy bodies he found and heads he would make for them. According to Ron, there were plenty of decoys around in those days and a lot of dealing going on with decoys. The first decoys he made were mostly canvasbacks, redheads and blackheads.

Early in 1949, Ron and his gunning buddies were riding down the street in Cambridge and saw some decoys in a store front window. Ron thought then that these were the prettiest decoys he had ever seen, but the store owner came out and said, "you boys can't afford these decoys, they are \$5.00 each." Later he found out, those decoys were made by two brothers from Crisfield. Lem and Steve Ward.

A proud member of the Mid-Atlantic chapter, Ron served in the U.S. Navy from 1949 to 1953 and was in the Korean war from 1950 until 1953. Ron states he never

saw more sea ducks than he saw in that area of the world. He recalls one day aboard ship during the Inchon invasion, the Captain told everyone to be on the lookout for mines. Shortly thereafter, Ron spotted a submarine periscope and reported it. Much to Ron's embarrassment, the periscope turned out to be a floating mop handle, although his superior officer assured him he did the right thing. Also, Ron remembers that the tide at Inchon, Korea raised thirty to forty feet and "you couldn't run fast enough to keep up with it or get out of its way."

After being discharged in February 1953 and returning to his beloved Dorchester County, Ron was anxious to resume hunting waterfowl. Once back home, he looked for his decoys without success and figured they were either sold or given away by his

brother Smitty. Once again, Ron started making more decoys for his hunting rig. Although most of these were made from wood, a few were made from cork.

In 1953 or 1954, Ron made his first decorative decoy, a merganser. When completed, he thought to himself "how can you get any better than this?" Having heard of the Ward Brothers from Crisfield and seeing some of their work, Ron decided to take his "masterpiece" down to Crisfield to show them how well he did. Steve Ward opened the door and asked Ron to come in. Ron looked down and saw a merganser decoy that was just finished by the Wards and was to be shipped to Illinois. After seeing this merganser, Ron knew that he only had "kindling wood" and left his carving outside on a rock. Steve asked Ron "what do you have there boy?" After showing him his carving, Steve had only praises

Ron is quick to say the Wards would never criticize a bird; they would only offer suggestions, if asked. The Wards were true gentlemen who were always willing to help the new and upcoming carvers. After that first visit, Ron would go see the Wards about once a month. At one point, he missed a visit or two and the Wards being concerned, sent someone to check on him. These visits and his friendship with the brothers attest to the

Ward's influence on Rue's carvings.

Ron continued making decoys each year, expanding and refining his work into beautifully carved decorative pieces and working decoys. Although small by today's standards, his total production has only reached about 4,000 of just about all species of waterfowl and shorebirds. All these were hatcheted out one at a time as Ron does not use a lathe. He has also carved many miniature ducks, geese, swans of various sizes and a few fish pins. Ron and his brother Smitty also made thousands of goose silhouettes.

During my interview with Mr. Rue, he loved to reflect back and tell stories of his past. He remembers a story from a Cambridge friend of his who has been collecting and dealing decoys for a long time. This friend was serving in the U.S. Army in the early 1950's and received a letter from his grandmother. She mentioned there was a nice young boy who stopped by and cleaned out her garage for \$5.00. As it turns out, this "nice boy" was Smitty Rue. When Ron's friend read this letter, he fell back in his bunk and thought, "I'm ruined," because he kept all his decoys in his grandmother's garage. According to Ron, his brother was just getting a lot of his decoys back with a little interest.

Ron was an exhibitor at the first Easton Waterfowl Festival, in 1971. Setting up his table in preparation for the first day of the show, the exhibitor next to Ron had three carvings on his table and four signs saying

"DO NOT TOUCH." Ron went home that night and made his sign for the opening morning of the show which said, "PLEASE TOUCH." Ron says, "you know, people, like to touch and look your decoys over and I get enjoyment from people who appreciate my work." Ron asserts that it, "wouldn't bother him even when kids came in and handled my birds; they were learning."

Since that first Easton show, Ron has been an exhibitor every year. He has seen this show grow and atttributes its success to two things: the town and county support of the show, and the public interest which encourages the exhibitors to do their very best. This author is certain that all those who attend the 1997 Havre de Grace show, meet Mr. Rue and look over his work, will agree that Ron did not disappoint anyone at the Easton show. Ron's carvings have won numerous contests and have lured many live waterfowl within range of hunters' guns. His carvings are much in demand and can be found in collections throughout the United States. Ron has been featured in many decoy publications and also teaches decoy carving and painting in Cambridge.

Mr. Rue is one of those notable decoy makers who have that special personality that compliments their ability. When ability and personality are in sync, then you have those special decoy makers the likes of Bob Litzenberg, Charlie Bryan, Jim Pierce, the Ward Brothers, for example, who are our Maryland treasures. Stop by the show in May and meet Ron and I'm certain you will agree when I say — Ron Rue is also one of our Maryland treasures and a true Chesapeake Bay classic!

# Festival Exhibitor Jim Taylor


# 1997/98 Maryland Duck Stamp Contest Winner

What a pleasant coincidente to write about Jim Taylor, and then find out that his acrylic painting, "Return to the Chesapeake," is the winner of the 1997/98 Maryland Duck Stamp Contest. This painting, featuring two flying canvasbacks, one of Jim's favorite species, was one of fifty-five entries from Maryland artists. This is the fifteenth year that Jim has entered the contest; a great example of hard work and persistence paying off.

Jim Taylor has been attending the Havre de Grace Decoy, Wildlife Art & Sportsman Festival as an exhibitor since 1985. The first year was a learning experience, Jim had brought a sheet to drape over the table, handmade business cards, and only six or seven paintings to sell. Even though Jim felt a little overwhelmed, the festival committee members were helpful, (especially James Pierce, says Jim), exhibitors were friendly, and the crowd was plentiful. Each year Jim improved his display, brought more artwork, and has his regular space in the Middle School cafeteria, table 184. Jim has now added limited edition prints to the selection of artwork.

The clarity of Jim Taylor's paintings is refreshing; the artwork is so crisp and clean you wonder how this could possibly be painted with a million brush strokes. A favorite of mine, "Tranquil Companions - Tundra Swans" is truly a peaceful look at these creatures. One look at the painting makes the viewer instantly forget



The ripples are almost graphic in nature, creating a wonderful depth and texture to the painting. The swans glide effortlessly through the water, alert but sensing no danger. The realistic portrayal of the swans enables the viewer to admire Jim's talent as well as appreciate his knowledge. Jim's careful attention to balance and placement ensures the strength of the overall composition.

Jim works mainly with acrylics and gets his research materials primarily from his own photos at such places as the Horsehead Sanctuary and the National Zoo. He also supplements his resources by buying slides from professional photographers. Before each painting, Jim sketches out the image. Then working on clayboard, Jim starts on the background first, then he may draw the waterfowl on a piece of tissue paper and

move it around to decide the placement. Jim accentuates his colors by building up the color layer by layer, then glazes over it with a light gray or light pink. Occasionally, Jim will use a little air brushing to soften the colors in the water ripples or the clouds, but never on the waterfowl. Lighting is important in the painting, a direct light source from a sunset or a sunrise adds a lot of drama to the piece. Last year Jim painted a redtailed hawk that was quite a challenge because of all of the colors; the reds, browns, and golds. The piece was more work than expected, but the end result was worth it.

Born and raised in Betterton in Kent County on Maryland's eastern shore, Jim has been painting since he was a young boy. Growing up in Kent County, Jim was exposed to the artwork of Jack Schroeder, Louis Frisino, and the carvings of Charlie Joiner. A 1983



# Festival Exhibitor Len Burcham

It is always nice to be surprised. I have known Len on a casual basis, but it was very enlightening to talk with him about his life and times in Havre de Grace. He is not only a decoy carver, hunter, and fisherman, but also a model boat builder and Chesapeake Bay preservationist.

Len Burcham was born and raised in Harford County and has spent most of his life in Havre de Grace. Since his father had no interest in hunting, fishing or boating, his grandfather became his biggest influence in his early years. Len's theory on this is "The Generation Jump." He believes that certain interests or trends skip a generation. To prove his point he states that his children, two daughters and a son, seem to show little interest in his pastimes. Through his love of water oriented activities, Len became an avid boater, fisherman and hunter. He has held a commercial fishing license, though now, he is only a recreational fisherman. Len's pride and joy was his 36' working fishing boat, the "Hard Times." He has even

made a model of it.

Len was a frequent hunter of ducks and geese on the Susquehanna Flats, as well as other local areas, such as Elk Neck and Otter Point. In the early days, the whole area was a hunter's wonderland. However, due to human constraints on ever shrinking habitats, environmental damage due to Hurricane Agnes, that too waned. Len's most active hunting years were at the change over from ducks to geese. For whatever reason, automated farming attracting the geese, loss of grasses for the ducks, etc., the duck population faded and the goose population dominated. Len asserts that even when canvasbacks were "the bird" (they were the duck of choice for hunters and local commercialization), a hunter would always take a goose if the opportunity presented itself.

Although he lived within a few blocks of the region's most renowned carvers, R. Madison Mitchell, Jim Currier, etc., and knew them on a personal basis, he did not become serious about decoy carving until about 1970. At that time, gunning decoys were finding new homes on peoples' shelves as folk art collectibles. Also, the old time carvers were winding down their operations. Len had dabbled with making decoys early on for his own use, but admits they were pretty basic. After all, they were good enough to fool the ducks and that was all that mattered.

A neighbor of Len's, Dick Hipple, was the person most instrumental in encouraging his carving. Dick Hipple was a skillful, seasoned waterman and well known for his boat making. In addition, Dick made a rig of decoys for himself and his son. He gave Len the original set of patterns for his decoys (which Len has loaned to the Decoy Museum to make archival copies).

Len admits he needed encouragement at first, but Dick told him, "No two damn ducks are alike, why should two decoys be alike?" With this in mind, he began to concentrate on enjoying carving instead of worrying about making production line birds. He is

Not a formally trained carver, he "did his own thing" to invent his personal style. Though carving is a hobby and not his livelihood, he still worries about the results of his work, as seems universal with all carvers. He is always changing or improving in some way.

Len likes the feel of the wood. It is only natural then that he does the bulk of his carving by hand with knives. A typical process will be to take the wood and blank out the body on a lathe, draw-knife more body detailing and then spoke-shave it. All heads are hand whittled. Len is not fond of painting and finds that process to be the most challenging. For this reason, he creates many natural wood birds where he can concentrate on the carving aspects. Although he is well equipped to do any type of carving, he does not consider himself a decorative carver and keeps to the slick and traditional style of decoys. His favorite bird to do is the blackhead (lesser scaup or bluebill, whichever you prefer). When asked about whether his carving style is more Harford County or Cecil County, he was quick to say that his style was "more middle of the river."

Another related project of decoy making has been to design his own molds to cast miniature lead weight birds. He makes hen and drake canvasbacks and mallards. They were featured in a Smithsonian Christmas catalog one year... without Len knowing!

When he gets tired of making decoys, he puts them aside and makes model boats. This sideline came about from all the scraps of wood left over from decoy carving. He limits the boat making to Chesapeake Bay boats. He has used his boat making expertise to help on a project to restore a burned model boat.

The model boat making was a surprise to me. Two of the boats are prominently displayed in Len's living room and they are spectacular. I was drawn to them immediately. Their detailing is superb. Apparently the tools he does not use for decorative decoy carving, he uses on these boats! I can't imagine how the fine detailing was achieved.

Another influence on Len was his friend, Jerry Parsons, who worked in Washington for the Library of Congress. They met at a decoy show in the mid-80's where Len was exhibiting. Through Jerry, he became involved with carving demonstrations at the Smithsonian and the Library of Congress. Len has many fond memories of his late friend. Their numerous

hunting adventures were quite haphazardly and funny. Len was very grateful for these special carving sessions and met a wider variety of people who otherwise would not have been exposed to the carving experience. He showed me a black duck from his china cupboard and told how Dan Quayle, then a Junior Senator, had inquired about the bird. Len said he could not sell it because he intended to give it to his wife. Guess that was one bird ol' Quayle couldn't flush out!

Len has been involved with the formation of legislative bills to help protect fishing on the bay. Len had previously been active with the Maryland's Waterman's Association with regards to area fisheries when he held a commercial fishing license.

With the advent of the founding of the Decoy Museum, he became a Life member, an exhibitor at our shows (only missed one) and a Weekend Carver. Hislove of carving and demonstrating it to others have been the high points of his efforts. He has been greatly moved by the people he has met, who have enjoyed the experience right along with him.

# Decoy Festival Visitors Carl and Lucille Nierzwicki

I recently had the pleasure of visiting a couple that are Decoy Festival regulars. As you approach the house on the hill, on the winding dirt road, you are not surprised that a decoy collector and duck hunter lives there. It is a beautiful tri-level lodge clinging to the ledge overlooking a small lake in Southern Vermont. Carl and Lucille Nierzwicki, live there with their extensive collection of decoys and hunting-related artifacts. Carl explained that when he retired from his business ventures in 1992 while still living in Bethesda, Maryland; his dream was to buy a little "fishing shack" in Vermont as a summer home. As he searched the state for the perfect place, he grew to love the area so much that he decided to move to the Green Mountain state permanently.

At that time, Carl probably had 150 decoys and was

adding to the collection steadily. He is emphatic that a collector and lover of decoys should live among his birds, not relegate them to a basement or outbuilding. "Some people collect stamps and coins and keep them out of sight or even in safe deposit boxes," Carl said. "Decoys need to be on display so that you can admire them, pick them up, heft them and feel the contours and texture of the bird." Indeed, on the ground level of the Nierzwicki home, they are part of the decor, blending in with the pine paneling, barn board and fieldstone fireplace. Lucille displays them to the best advantage. adding hunting related artifacts and mixing in miniatures for contrast. Carl includes some of his professionally mounted birds bagged in hunts of the past. Originally the collection was confined to this room, but it has spilled over into the adjacent den and even upstairs to the living room.

Carl was born in Chicago and hunted ducks and geese in Illinois and Wisconsin as a boy and teenager. One of his fondest recollections is the annual "Coot Shoot" on Grass Lake in Illinois to which his Uncle Harry took him and his cousin Robert every year. Hunters from all over the area would converge on the lake in October when thousands of coots were feeding. They would arrive early in the morning and position themselves, two in a boat about seventy-five yards apart all over the lake. At the sound of a cannon fired, when everyone was ready, they all blazed away at the hapless coots, felling them by the dozens.

After a hitch in the Navy, where he saw action in the Pacific, Carl returned to Chicago and graduated from Northwestern University. As an employee of Motorola, he was transferred to Washington, D.C. in 1954 where he met Lucille, married and took up residence in Bethesda, Maryland. He soon met other duck hunters, joined the Izaak Walton League, a conservation organization, and hunted locally in the Chesapeake Bay, Potomac River, and even into the city limits of Washington. He and some friends leased a blind on Kent Island where they hunted for ten years. They

Box 9 Havre de Grace, MD 21078 (410) 557-6751 used a variety of decoys, old hand-me-downs, papermaché ducks, and some carved by a fellow hunter, Joe Fitzwater, which intrigued him for their utilitarian beauty. As he became more familiar with the Chesapeake area, he noted lots of Madison Mitchell decoys being used there. One day, Carl came across a bushel basket of canvasbacks, bluebills, and redheads by Mitchell selling for \$25 dollars each. He bought the whole basket and realized he had started his collection. They were too nice to hunt over!

As his collection grew, Carl began to collect the works of other Chesapeake Bay area carvers as well as many from Virginia, New Jersey, and Delaware. Some of his favorites are Mitchell, Litzenberg, Charlie Bryan, the Wards, and John Mulak, a carver from Yarmouth Port. Massachusetts: who carves his own gunning decoys with unusual detail and relief. For decoratives, Bob Thau of Kent Island, Maryland, is his carver of choice. The Nierzwickis have been members of the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum since 1991, and have been going to the Decoy, Wildlife Art, & Sportsman Festival for about seven years. They especially like the auctions where many of the pieces in their collection were purchased. Like any other decoy collector, Carl is always on the prowl for the elusive and rare "big one" at antique stores, flea markets, yard sales, and country auctions.

Carl and Lucille have succeeded in putting together a beautiful and well-integrated collection of both gun-

ning and decorative decoys that reflects their love and extensive knowledge of the subject. It is artfully displayed in a charming home, truly an inspiration to collectors everywhere. Carl explained his philosophy and advice to the new collector. "First, understand the use and history of the decoy, especially as it relates to your local area. Start there and develop a collection around what was used there, the carvers who lived and still live there. Study the classics, appreciate form and function, and buy what is pleasing to your eye and affordable." Wise advice from a man who has put it to good use.







# **Book Review**


# **American Bird Decoys**

By William J. Mackey, Jr. Reviewed by Bill Smart

Anyone associated with the hobby or business of collecting decoys has at one time or another been made aware of Bill Mackey and his fabulous collection. American Bird Decoys, when first published in 1965, shared the fruits of nearly forty years of research and collecting with the novice and seasoned decoy collector. Mackey's love for this great American folk art is readily apparent throughout his work. As a hunter, student, and historian, he combined his first-hand knowledge, photographs and the benefit of his relationships and conversations with some of the most prominent carvers of the 20th century, into one of the first decoy reference books.


Mackey was a pioneer in the decoy collecting field. His timely writing of this book served to fill a void for collectors as this relatively new hobby gained acceptance during the mid-1960s. Having amassed a superb collection of thousands of decoys, he left his professional career to document his knowledge and share his experiences and insights with his fellow collectors. In doing so, he drafted a ready reference which included eighteen chapters of text.

Focusing predominantly on decoys and folk art carvings of the Atlantic Coast, he provided a fine collection of photographs from his personal collection. Many of the decoys he refers to are rare and have a strong sense of history. As an example, in the chapter documenting the Susquehanna Flats and Upper Chesapeake, he provides a picture of a Dick Howlett canvasback. According to Mackey, this bird was made between 1850 and 1860 and was owned by Jim Currier for sixty years. Other chapters refer to decoy history, vanishing birds, shore birds, unusual birds, confidence decoys, and factory decoys. Included too are tips on collecting (some still quite valuable to the new collector today), and a chapter on decoys as folk art by Quintina Colio.



Although some of Mackey's information is dated, this book remains one of the staples for the decoy collector and historian's reference library. This book is out of print, however, I suspect that there are a few to be had from exhibitors at the Havre de Grace Decoy, Wildlife Art and Sportsman Festival this year.

American Bird Decoys is 255 pages and was first published in 1965 by E.P. Duton and Co., Inc., New York. A second edition was published in 1987.


