Tom Humberstone with decoys he made

TOM HUMBERSTONE of Skaneateles, New York, is the Honorary Chairman for this year's Havre De Grace Decoy Museum Decoy & Wildlife Art Festival, the Museum's 30th. Skaneateles is a small town southwest of Syracuse on one of upper New York State's Finger Lakes. This area is home to many of North America's migrating waterfowl such as Canada Geese which seek out the marshy lands around the Chesapeake Bay and in New Jersey as they migrate south.

We first met Tom Humberstone and his lovely wife Betsy at the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum's 24th Annual Dinner last November at the Bayou Restaurant where he contributed fifteen pairs of canvasback decoys to the live auction. When Tom was introduced as the next Honorary Chairman for the Havre De Grace Decoy Museum Decoy & Wildlife Art Festival, he told guests, "This is an extreme honor for me to be a part of the group of honorary chairmen." We came to know Tom as warm, friendly and sincere in his dedication to the Museum and fellow carvers and collectors.

The following weekend we met Tom and Betsy at the Easton Waterfowl Show which proved to be a great weather week-

end for the enormous and popular festival on Maryland's Eastern Shore of the Chesapeake Bay. It was interesting to see how many of the visitors to the show knew Tom. One couple asked if he would have time to make a pair of Labrador ducks for the Havre de Grace Show in May. Tom smiled and said, "Maybe."

Some background on Tom Humberstone: He and Betsy have two sons, Michael and Jason. All of them enjoy fishing, and their sons also hunt like their father. Tom and Betsy are Life Members of Ducks Unlimited, the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum, Bayman's Museum in Tuckerton, New Jersey, and the Thousand Islands Museum in Clayton, New York, near the St. Lawrence River. Tom is also a Life Member of the National Rifle Association.

He was inducted into the New York State Outdoorsman Hall of Fame in 1995 for his work in conservation. Tom was also honored by New York State Ducks Unlimited as New York State's Conservationist of the Year, 2010. When he received this particular honor, he was given a prized possession: a Patrick Vincenti Black Duck decoy. Tom said that it was better than the award title itself


because Pat is a very close friend of his. (Patrick "Pat" Vincenti is President of the Board of the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum.)

Vincenti said of Tom, "He is extremely knowledgeable about decoys from his area—the St. Lawrence River, Great Lakes area. He shares the passion of old decoy makers." He noted that Tom and he have been friends since the early 1980's and, despite the distance, Tom is an active member of the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum and an advocate for the Festivals and for the R. Madison Mitchell Endowment Fund and he and Betsy attend every event and dinner.

After graduating from high school,

Tom worked for Acme Markets as a journeyman meat-cutter. In 1967 he became a firefighter with the City of Syracuse and retired in 1996 after twenty-nine years as a Lieutenant on an Engine Company. He "still misses the camaraderie and the profession." However, Tom feels that firefighting is a young person's job.

Humberstone started hunting in 1965 and became an avid waterfowler right away. At this time he also became a collector of old decoys. This prompted an interest in making his own hunting rigs. The 1960's plastic decoys had become the norm for hunting. While at the Clayton Decoy Show in the mid-1970's, Tom met Mike Waverchak, a local carver from

Memphis, New York. Waverchak taught Tom how to make decoys—and the rest is history! It was also Mike Waverchak who introduced him to Ken Harris, another famous decoy maker from the area. Harris allowed Tom to watch him work and taught him some valuable techniques. Pat Vincenti said Harris was the most prolific of decoy carvers.

Because of Tom's love for waterfowling history, he has hunted with Pat for the past three years in the upper Chesapeake Bay area. He and Betsy were here in January for hunting and other events. The men have good luck with Broadbills (Blackheads) but Canvasbacks have eluded them. (Tom wondered if the Cans are trying to tell them something.)


Tom carves in the manner of the St. Lawrence River carvers from the northern section of New York State. He uses white cedar or white pine for his hunting decoys and finishes them with oil paints. The cork decoys he makes are also finished in oil paints. Since 1975 Tom has carved many different species of waterfowl but he prefers to make Black Ducks and Canvasbacks.

His sense of humor shows in describing his two shops, one in his barn at Skaneateles and one at their camp on Black Lake in Hammond, New York. He said that Betsy refuses to clean his shop in the barn with all the sawdust and shavings on the floor. When someone came from Ducks Unlimited in Kingston, Ontario, to take a picture of the barn, he and Betsy recoiled at the thought. However, when the photo was developed, they laughedthe sawdust in the cobwebs actually made an interesting scene! And a friend suggested he heat the barn so he can continue working there all year. Tom chuckled, "It would probably burn down!"

For the past three years Tom has been coming to the Level Volunteer Fire Department's Hall in Maryland for the "Susquehanna Flats Vintage Hunting and Fishing Collectible Show." There he is able to buy and sell vintage waterfowling items. He truly enjoys the decoys from all areas of the country but has a special fondness for the decoys and history of the Chesapeake Bay area.

This year Tom is also Chairman of the annual Clayton Decoy & Wildlife Art & Sporting Collectibles Show which is sponsored by the Thousand Islands Museum at Clayton. This is its 43rd year. The show runs July 15th and 16th. This year could be a great summer trip north to see Tom and the other St. Lawrence carvers.

With Tom and Betsy's January visit to Maryland at an end, we looked forward to seeing them again at the R. Madison Mitchell Endowment Dinner to be held in March. Tom will return in May for the 30th Havre De Grace Decoy Museum Decoy & Wildlife Art Festival as Honorary Chairman. Look for Tom with his exhibit of duck working decoys!

The Passion for Collecting & Caretaking



I have too much stuff. I keep too much stuff. The stuff in my life says a lot about me. The stuff of our lives helps us to recall, to remember, to reflect on the good

times, the sad times, the fun times of days long gone.

I have kept a journal for many years. My mother and my grandmother kept journals. My father and grandfathers kept notes, receipts, time records, and letters of important events in their lives. Those items constituted their journals. I now have the ability to have a glimpse back to times in my family's past. I can see what their daily routines were; I can share their joys and frustrations by opening up their archives. Those items give direction and meaning to my collecting and continue to inspire me.

In addition to those journals and the journals and logs of others, I collect a few other items aside from my decoys. In a recent search through one of my storage areas, I came across a box of Native American ax heads and tomahawk heads. I was given those items by the widow of a local stone mason many years ago. That mason collected Native American stone artifacts and traveled throughout the area searching shorelines almost 100 years ago. They were his lifelong collection and were presented to me for my safe keeping.

The instructions that came with them were brief but still

echo in my mind, "take care of those stones, John Sullivan; my husband collected those throughout his life and they meant so much to him." Shortly before a trip down memory lane with those old stone artifacts I opened up another box. The odor of mothballs permeated the air before I had removed the lid. The moment the lid came off I was transported back to an attic in Berlin on Maryland's Eastern Shore on a blistering hot day in the summer of 1994. It was on that day that my oldest decoy friend, Henry A. Fleckenstein, Jr., and I crawled through the attic of Donald Walker.

The Walker family vacationed in Ocean City, Maryland, for decades beginning before 1900. They shot duck, geese, and shorebirds on their annual trips. They carved their own decoys and purchased shorebird decoys from the Mason Decoy Factory in Detroit, Michigan. I long to return to that attic to see if there is anything that I might have missed. The contents of this box, which might well have no appeal to any collector but me, was filled with bird skins from Ocean City, Maryland. The skins were of shore birds and ducks that Donald's father, Robert Craighead Walker, shot on the beach in Ocean City. Each specimen has its original tag fastened around the bird's leg. The tag indicates the date in the 1920's when the bird was shot, the species, the sex of the bird, and where it was shot, on the beach or on the bay side.

Out of respect for this collection, I had written a note of when Henry and I had made the discovery and when I packed them in the box. I removed most of the shorebirds to take home to display. The bird skins like the Indian artifacts were collections of someone else, yet I feel compelled to make them part of my collection.

I find them as fascinating today as on the day that they came into my caretaking. Will someone who follows me find them as fascinating as I? I certainly hope so, but if not, I just hope that someone will say someday that "he had a good eye, didn't he?" Or maybe, "he really had some neat stuff." But most importantly, they just might say, "He really was a caretaker, wasn't he?". ■

IN MEMORIAM Remembering EDWARD LEROY WATTS September 30, 1935 –November 29, 2010

Edward Leroy Watts is remembered by members of the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum with much fondness. This fraternity of decoy carvers shared many stories, both serious and cheery, of Ed's generosity and dedication to the Museum. Patrick Vincenti, President of the Board of the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum, knew Ed not only as a past president of the Museum and a fellow member of the Board of Directors, but as a close friend. He spoke with pride in knowing Ed for his involvement with other nonprofit and volunteer organizations, as well, both local and across the country.

Several of us Museum members were with Mr. Vincenti at the Memorial Service which was held in

December in Ed's church. The Watts family spoke of his generosity with the ability to pull out his checkbook when he saw a need or an opportunity to assist someone somehow. And so it was with his generosity for the Decoy Museum, Vincenti recounted. "It is more important to think of the man not the checkbook. For the Museum, the festivals, the many events, Ed Watts was always there."

He came with his son Michael Watts to burn decoys after the last hospital visit in November, "and I gave him hell," to quote Vincenti. Ed was eager to do whatever he could to support the Decoy Museum. Vincenti said Ed was concerned about the debt on the construction of the decoy gallery and exhibits. It should come as no surprise that Ed requested remembrances of him to be made to the Havre de Grace Decoy Museum.

Jerry Rutkowski, also a member of the Board, remembered Ed as a strong supporter of the Upper Chesapeake Chapter of Delta Waterfowl. The two organizations "grew a strong bond and helped each other grow," Jerry recounted, as he and Ed worked together in making this happen for the benefit of both the Decoy Museum and Delta Waterfowl. "Mr. Watts…left a pair of shoes that cannot be filled."

Dale Heitkamp recalled how Ed "managed the Decoy Show's Carving Competition. He always encouraged the youth to get into the hobby of

carving and entering the competitions. He will be missed by all at the Museum."

Kenny Stevenson also worked in concrete construction with Ed—high rise office buildings, schools and such. "Ed was my foreman and my mentor...always brought out the best in me and everyone on the crew...There are few days that go by that I don't think about the things I learned from Ed."

Ed's friendliness with everyone he met was remembered by Margaret C. Jones, who is the Special Events/Education Coordinator for the Museum. Her daughter considered him another grandfather. Indeed, he was the jolly grandfather to

seven and great-grandfather to nine. He leaves behind two sons and a daughter, a sister, many relatives and many friends.

In addition to his documented volunteer contributions, Ed was a long-time carver of decoys, other birds, and unique creations. For example, several truly impressive decoys and sculptures convey Ed's depth of perception and attention to detail. There was a Santa Claus figure about nine inches tall with a mug of cocoa in his right hand. It was carved and sculpted, the chipping marks uniform on Santa's figure with the "stitching marks" of a sewing machine standing out for the observer to see. Santa was in his BVDs; when turned around he gave the viewer a peek of an open "trap door" in the rear of his BVDs...Ed's sense of humor.

Perhaps the most outstanding of his sculpted creations is the huge moose antler which is brownish in color. One can see the bone grain. Ed carved out most of the large bone area and within that space he carved five white flying geese in a vertical formation. The white is the inside of the antler bone plate. The piece is exquisite in its detail; absolutely a treasure to behold. It is as if the geese were in there all the time, just waiting for him to carve away the rest of the bone plate.

Edward Leroy Watts left behind the admiration of his colleagues in whatever capacity he worked. He left behind fellow hunters and carvers and collectors. He gave without a thought of himself in the act of giving. He left behind his love for all and for all of us to remember. He is missed.
